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twenty years of education transformation in gauteng 1994 to 2014 an independent review presents a collection of 15 important essays on different aspects of education in gauteng since the advent of democracy in 1994 these essays talk to what a provincial education department does and how and why it does these things whether it be about policy resourcing or implementing projects each essay is written by one or more specialist in the relevant focus area the book is written to be

accessible to the general reader as well as being informative and an essential resource for the specialist reader it sheds light on aspects of how a provincial department operates and why and with what consequences certain decisions have been made in education over the last 20 turbulent years both nationally and provincially there has been no attempt to fit the books chapters into a particular ideological or educational paradigm and as a result the reader will find differing views on various aspects of the gauteng department of educations present and past we leave the reader to decide to what extent the gde has fulfilled its educational mandate over the last 20 years

this monograph reports on south africa s performance in timms 2003 relative to 50 other countries describes the performance of different groups of learners in south africa and provides contextual information about teachers schools and the curriculum the report concludes with recommendations for strategic interventions to improve south african learners performance in mathematics and science the findings contained in this report offer valuable insights to academics policymakers curriculum planners and teachers and those involved in the development of education in south africa

had ambitious goals at the outset of its transition from apartheid to democracy it explores how the interaction of politics and institutions affects educational outcomes by examining lessons learned from how south africa failed to achieve many of its goals it constructs an innovative alternative strategy for making process combining practical steps to achieve incremental gains to re orient the system towards learning

this book explores policy and practice in teacher education in south africa and their implications for the future it arises from the work of the multi site teacher education research programme muster co ordinated by the university of sussex in five countries of which south africa is one teacher education in south africa is in transition the first wave of educational reform rightly focused on the need to develop a post apartheid school curriculum and the new structures that were needed to support different approaches to learning teacher education was made a provincial competence and left largely untouched until new norms and standards and a regulatory framework began to be developed

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
